A clinical examination and review of your medical and dental history has been completed. There is no universally accepted answer concerning whether wisdom teeth should be extracted, however it has been recommended to you on account of your individual needs.					
The treatment decision is individualized and considers pertinent surgical factors such as surgical difficulty, clinician experience and risk of complications and outcomes. Your reasons for removal include:					
	Discomfort / soft tissue swelling				
	Difficulty chewing / opening				
	Infection (or history of same)				
	Incipient or true cavities in the tooth or neighboring teeth				
	Gum defects (reservoirs for anaerobic bacteria)				
	Difficulty	with hon	ne care /	plaque cor	ntrol
<b>Potential risks associated with third molar removal are rare</b> but have also been well documented. The most common complications of third molar surgery are: bleeding, infection, alveolar osteitis (dry socket), nerve injury, damage to adjacent teeth, oral-sinus communication, the development or worsening of periodontal (gum) defects and TMJ problems (clicking, strain)					
A higher rate of complications may come with patient age (22% of over 65-year-olds compared with 3% of 15-20-year-olds), depth of tooth impaction, female gender, smoking, stress, and increased BMI.
